

## Replacement of the spare pepper spray can of the TORNADO spray flashlight

**WARNING:** When handling full or even empty spray, strictly ensure that the spray nozzle is **ALWAYS** pointed away from your body and **NEVER** at another person. When the contents of the TORNADO spray can are used up, the flashlight module can be fit onto another spray can in the following manner:

- 1) Hold the original empty spray can so that its nozzle is pointing away from your body.
- 2) Lift the flashlight cover and use a flat object (e.g. knife or screwdriver) to remove the spray nozzle release button in the upwards direction – proceed with caution. See Fig. 1.
- 3) Unscrew with cross-point screwdriver the 2 cross-head screws – see Fig. 2 – and pull the “flashlight module” upwards. See Fig. 2a.
- 4) Remove the protective cap from the spare spray can – see Fig. 3 – and then remove the release button of the spray nozzle – see Fig. 3a. Use this new release button for this new spray can. Never





use the old release button from the original empty spray!

- 5) Put the original “flashlight module” on the head of the new spray can – see Fig. 4 – and tighten the 2 cross-head screws with cross-point screwdriver – see Fig. 4a.
- 6) Hold the spray can in such a way that the hole for the nozzle is pointed away from your body.
- 7) With caution, slide in the release button in the downwards direction. **Beware!** If you push too hard, the contents of the pepper spray could jet out! Gently push the spray release button away from you towards the flashlight module. The release button must fit into two horizontal grooves in the head and at the same time it must be lightly seated on the tube of the spray valve – see Fig. 5. Fig. 6 shows the correct position of the inserted nozzle, when the curve of the head is at the same level as the curve of the release button.
